Citizen Alert

Heavy rains cause flood concerns around rivers and dams in Stonington, Mystic and Pawcatuck. ENS used to warn of flood concerns and prepare for evacuations.

3/30/10

6:00 am

Conference Call

EOC and first responders notified of pending flooding and mandatory evacuations of affected areas. Instructed to assemble.

3/30/10

7:00 am

Map-Based Alert

High water levels at Birdland section dams. Evacuation instructions and emergency shelter information provided.

7:30 am

Map-Based Alert

Evacuation instructions sent to 118 Cove Road residents.

3/30/10

10:51 am

Map-Based Alert

Evacuation instructions sent to 272 Main Street/Old Mystic Village residents and businesses.

3/30/10

11:02 am

Map-Based Alert

Evacuation instructions sent to 1,675 Lower Pawcatuck residents and businesses.

3/30/10

12:08 pm

Map-Based Alert

Evacuation instructions sent to 123 Sylvania Pond residents and businesses.

12:08 pm

Map-Based Alert

26 Collins Road/Bridge closure notice sent to residents and businesses.

Recovery messages sent to residents and businesses citywide. Flood relief instructions provided.



How the CT Alert Emergency Notification System Works




Emergency

Severe weather, natural disasters and public health risks threaten lives and property. CT Alert informs residents and businesses of emergency situations.



Notify

Public safety officials notify residents of an emergency by accessing the Everbridge system via computer, phone or web-enabled device to send out an emergency alert.



Reach

The statewide E-911 enables authorities to communicate critical information to all citizens quickly and efficiently across multiple communication devices.



Protect

Citizens receive information about life-threatening emergencies, such as natural disasters, man-made disasters and public health threats.
